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



Performative Methods in the Design of Architectural Lighting

- According to the Danish architect and former professor at the School of Architecture, Steen Eiler Rasmussen, - 'Architecture, ... not merely to be seen from the outside. The architect is a sort of theatrical producer, the man who plans the settings of our lives ... He sets the stage for a long, slowmoving performance which must be adaptable enough to accommodate unforseen improvisations' (in Rasmussen, S.E., 1959 Experiencing Architecture pp10-12)
- As an opposition to the dominance of a visual culture, in his book The Eyes of the Skin, the Finish architect Juhani Pallasmaa point out the complexity of our much larger perceptive capacities, and he suggests a much broader perspective in the research on spatial questions (Pallasma, Juhani, 2005, The Eyes of the Skin; Architecture and the senses)
- The Danish theorist on architectonic matters, Marianne Krog Jensen, shares these concerns in her article *Space Unfolded*, taking even a further step by arguing that 'architecture is a cultural action We no longer asks what architecture is; we ask what it does. Space is something that unfolds; it is defined through movement, action and creation'. (Her article is from the book *entitled How architecture shapes behaviour mind your behaviour*, 2010, Kim Herforth 3xN & Kent Martinussen DAC (eds))

- How to develop a methodological approach that facilitate a more holistic experiential position ... in education as well as in research
- The field of Theatre Anthropology offers some very useful terms to contextualise investigations from experiential accounts 'pre-expressive capacities', 'daily state', 'extra daily state' ... (see: Barba, Eugenio & Savarese, Nicola, 1995, The secret art of the performer)
- Psycophysical exercises, techniques developed as training systems in the daily praxis of the performer ... facilitate methods 'in order to culivate ...inner awareness toward a heightened ... state of engagement' ... (Zarrili, Phillip 2010, Senses an Silence in Actor Training and Performance, p 57)

- How to extract and introduce performative methods in the teaching of nonperformers ... such as architects
- How to transfer performative methods as investigating analysis in the perception of spatiality











